3.04.010 Permits, Anchoring, and Mooring

a. Any person may temporarily anchor a single vessel with no more than one attached skiff, for a period of not more than 72 hours, in the Anchorage Area without a permit, subject to the nighttime occupancy limitations of Section 3.04.010(c) below. A skiff may not be separately anchored, but shall remain attached to the vessel. No person may anchor a vessel in the Non-Anchorage Area at any time. The Harbormaster is authorized to require persons to relocate vessels within the designated anchorage areas. After 72 hours have expired, the vessel must leave Richardson Bay for at least seven days before it may temporarily anchor again pursuant to this subsection.

b. A person may anchor or moor a vessel in Richardson Bay for more than 72 hours only with an anchoring permit issued by the Harbormaster.

c. A person may anchor or moor a vessel in Richardson Bay after sunset and before sunrise only under one of the following conditions:

1. A person capable of operating the vessel continuously occupies the vessel from sunset until sunrise, except that person may leave the vessel for up to four hours once per night.
2. A person obtains a nighttime anchoring permit issued by the Harbormaster authorizing the person to leave the vessel unattended from sunset until sunrise.
